### **BRITISH GLASS BIENNALE - ARTISTS ANNOUNCED!**

The Ruskin Glass Centre, in association with the Worshipful Company of Glass Sellers, is delighted to announce the artists for the 2017 British Glass Biennale exhibition. Over two days an expert panel of judges chaired by Scott Benefield and comprised of Rosy Greenlees OBE, Barbara Beadman, Aonghus Gordon and Maja Heuer, selected the very best of this year's entries, all of which achieved a very high standard.

Sixty one artists were selected out of 231 applicants to present the most interesting, diverse and outstanding glass art made in the UK in the last two years. The work will form a cutting edge showcase of contemporary British based glass talent with £11,000 worth of awards to be won. Prize winners will be announced at the awards ceremony on 24 August at the Ruskin Glass Centre, Stourbridge.

Both established artists and emerging new talent will be on display, including work by 13 students. The selected artists have been brave and innovative, using a wide range of styles and techniques both traditional and experimental. The decision to open the submission to British artists living abroad was more than justified, with 12 entrants from France, Spain, Belgium, Hungary, Japan, Australia, Switzerland, India and the USA.

Scott Benefield commented "We had a very diverse group serving on the jury this year, and I think the pieces that we chose reflect not only the range of work that was submitted (which was quite wide) but also the differing backgrounds of the jurors. In the final round of viewing, we were very selective but everything that made it into the exhibition had its advocates who made a persuasive argument for its inclusion.

The experience left me feeling confident about the quality and breadth of contemporary glass in the UK and I think that's going to make for a very dynamic exhibition."
