Mosaic workshops

During a recent event organised by the Webb Corbett Visitor Centre, now known as the Glasshouse Heritage Centre, Stourbridge residents were invited to bring in glass that had been dug up in their gardens. One lady brought in an amazing array of scrap glass that of glass that had been unearthed by foxes. Investigations led by Glass Heritage Officer Ian Dury, established this was from the waste tip of the Thomas Webb Factory that operated between 1837 – 1990.

The idea evolved that for the 2017 International Festival of Glass these remnants could be utilised to make four glass window panes depicting four of the key elements that became associated with the early glassmaking in this area; coal, fireclay, glasshouses and canals. These four elements will be featured in a contemporary mosaic design drawn by a leading mosaic artist, Birmingham based Caroline Jariwala, to produce four unique murals that will then be installed in the front of the Glasshouse heritage centre.

And here is your opportunity to partake in this exciting initiative to rejuvenate these ancient scraps into contemporary works of art.

Throughout the Festival there are eight opportunities for members of the public to assist Caroline. This will be by way of morning and afternoon sessions on each day of 25th – 28th August. Admission is free with a festival pass. Each session can accommodate a maximum of 6, which means there are a total of only 48 places (minimum age 10 years, please).
