Heritage Lottery Fund bid - latest

We devote the lead in this edition to the news that our bid to the Heritage Lottery Fund has been deferred pending the submission of further information.



This is *not* a 'refusal' and is in fact standard procedure when a funding body is seeking to establish that every conceivable aspect of the bid has been addressed and covered.

BGF and its partners remain optimistic that the outcome will be positive.

This year we are hosting our own Christmas Tree Festival in the beautiful historic environment of The Red House Glass Cone from Saturday 18th November 2017 to Sunday 7th January 2018.

The trees will be within the Cone and around the site. Each tree will be decorated by your group or business, reflecting 'who you are'. An interpretation plaque will be placed by your tree and you are welcome to leave leaflets by your tree.

Your tree can be real, artificial or something in the shape of a tree provided it's no taller that 5 feet. All trees must be collected by 3pm on 7th January 2018. After this date we will dispose of them.

We will provide electricity for one set of lights but you are welcome to use battery-operated lights (please bring spares).

Participation is free. We will have collection boxes for donations to The Mayors charities, which for this year are: Dudley Mind, The YMCA and Dudley Alzheimer's Society.

We will be open from 10am until 3pm in the week and 11am until 4pm at the weekend. The Cone will be closed 24 December until 3 January 2018.

We decided not to run an October fair at Knebworth this year so our next event at Knebworth House will be on the 25th February 2018. Our next event this year will be the National Glass Fair to be held at the National Motorcycle Museum in Solihull, West Midlands B92 0EJ on Sunday 12th November from 10.30am until 4.00pm. Admission is £5.

There will be an exhibition provided by the Carnival Glass Society of an outstanding collection of carnival and other glass that has been gifted to them. This will include rare examples of European carnival and other glass, numerous Sowerby items, both in carnival and non-carnival glass and some American and unusual Indian glass.

There will be new faces among the exhibitors including 'Glass and Teak' from Sweden who will be showing Swedish glass, Neville Platt Antiques specialising in 18th and 19th century glasses and Jeff Sims Antiques who will be selling Georgian table glass and contemporary Art Glass. Also showing for the first time will be Mike and Susan Hunter, contemporary glass artists from Twists Glass Studio in Scotland. We are also pleased to welcome back Brian Carruthers from Bac to Basics Antiques who specialises in Victorian and Edwardian coloured glass.

Cambridge sculptor Jilly Cunningham has now made the switch to home décor. Unimpressed by the unimaginative options available in light switches, Jilly decided to make her own. Her first collection of shimmering light switches are fully functional works of art, hand crafted in Murano and Tiffany stained glass and will be on sale.'
