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DATA PROTECTION UPDATE - PLEASE ACT NOW

Thanks to all who have responded thus far to our consent form in GC125 et sub.

A final reminder that under The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) that comes into force on 25th May 2018 a crucial element of the new legislation is that in order to continue to contact you we must have your express and unambiguous consent to do so.

We need your consent *before* the compliance deadline in order that we can update our records in time for it. If you haven't notified us by the compliance date then we may lose you, as we will be unable to use our old lists to contact you again. And we don't want that to happen if we can avoid it.

If you haven't yet completed your consent form then *please* do so a.s.a.p. There is copy attached with this edition. If you are unable for any reason to complete it, or if you have been away and simply don't know what we're talking about, then contact bgf@britishglassfoundation.org.uk

Glass at BCLM

Our colleague Clare Weston has drawn our attention to two events up-and-coming at a Black Country Living Museum somewhere near you. Both are being run by Charlotte Hughes-Martin, so those who know her will appreciate you're in be in good hands. For those who don't, Charlotte is a renowned glassmaker of 15 years standing currently based at the Red House Glass Cone in Wordsley. She has an extensive exhibitions record; she appears in the book 25 Years of New Glass Review by Tina Oldknow and has recently been included in the collection of Ebeltoft Glass Museum in Denmark. Charlotte often combines glass with a mixed media approach to create sculptural work and quirky objects that are influenced by how she sees the world.



Glass Painting 16th June 2018 (10am-4pm)

Learn the basics of traditional glass painting in enamels using tracing, stippling and graffito. Once fired, your pictures will be permanent and, like the painted glass in churches, will still be beautiful in a thousand years' time!

Glass Engraving 8th September 2018 (10am-4pm)

Learn the basics of hand-engraving glass in a fun class ideal for beginners wanting to spend a creative day making something special. The course will cover technique and pattern and you will have the choice of creating your own designs or working from found images. You will learn to engrave on both flat glass and create a personalised drinking glass to take home.
