Major donation to BGF funds

Here is an extract from a BGF press release that just about says it all. It is wonderful news and we are eager to share it with our readership...

The British Glass Foundation (BGF) is delighted to announce the securing of a grant of £25,000 from the Clive and Sylvia Richards Charity towards the fit out of the new White House *Cone museum of glass* in Wordsley. The former Stuart Crystal site is being transformed into a world-class facility and a new home for the renowned Stourbridge Glass collection.

The funding was awarded following a recent invitation by the Clive and Sylvia Richards Charity for representatives of BGF to address them personally at their base in Herefordshire in order to express the BGF case for funding.

This successful application will complement anticipated grant funding from HLF and will substantially contribute towards internal fit out of the skeleton building, which is already complete courtesy of project partners Complex Developments Ltd, Dudley MBC and the ERDF.

Graham Knowles, Chairman BGF said: 'This wonderful gesture from the Clive and Sylvia Richards Charity is fantastic news and is indicative of the widespread support the project to provide a new home for the internationally renowned Stourbridge Glass collection has engendered. This money will allow us to give the new facility the 'wow' factor that will encourage people through the doors to celebrate our unique glass heritage and is a vital aid in creating a visitor attraction that will welcome people from all over the world.'

Clive Richards of the Clive and Sylvia Richards Charity added: 'Our Charity is delighted to have helped in this innovative new museum to ensure that the Stourbridge Glass Industry will be remembered forever."

The Clive and Sylvia Richards Charity (Our aim is to 'make a difference') is committed to supporting Education, Healthcare, Heritage and Arts. We will provide support to charity organisations where we seek to be a catalyst to unlock other funding sources for good causes and ensure sustainability and transformational change. A new dawn


