The power of GlassCuts - again

So, there we were, lazing in the shimmering opulence of GlassCuts Towers when the ping on our computer revealed a message from reader Penny Baker who says: 'I am in possession of a Stuart

crystal beer mug and am trying to ascertain its pattern. I would really appreciate it if you could help with the identification. Here's an image of it.'

No sooner the word that the deed, we were straight

No sooner the word that the deed, we were straight on the blower to a lifelong glass-man who spent many years at Stuart's, our ol' pal Ian Dury. Ian is retired now but still keeps his eye on the ball and, no surprise, within minutes he came back to us.

'I can confirm this is Stuart's beer mug. However, it was not part of a range. We did lots of miscellaneous Items that were not catalogued with



a pattern name but were just referred to by a number. Leave it with me and I'll get back to you.'

Barely an hour later, he did just that. 'Hallo again' says he: 'I've just found this in the 1956 catalogue (where does he keep this lot? - Ed) and the top right hand corner is Pattern number 25864. There are several tankards on this page which have pattern names: top left Woodchester (The late Queen Mother's favourite pattern); mid top: Grape and Vine; Bottom right: Arundel. The pattern number 25864 would suggest it was designed in the 1930's. Some might mistake this pattern as Carlingford 27519 but Carlingford had a central split above the diamond and again some may confuse it with Glengarry which was on the same blank but the diamonds had a filling. The cutting description is: single row of chains, single row of diamonds, punty base which would have been hand polished. The chains and diamonds would have been roughed and smoothed.'
