The power of GlassCuts (an occasional series)

No sooner than the last issue and our *Look what I found* item hit cyberspace we had an almost instantaneous response to our appeal for information on that big blank cameo vase unearthed in our Chairman's secret bolt-hole. Good friend and supporter of BGF Dilwyn Hier, he of *Antique Stourbridge Glass* <u>http://antiquestourbridgeglass.co.uk</u> was straight on the case to bring us this solid gold nugget of info:

Hi Graham (and hello to you - Ed). The Chairman's cameo blank looks to be in the same vain as the Aurora vase, it being the first cameo vase manufactured by Thomas Webb & Sons. It was carved by Thomas Woodall for the Paris Exposition 1878. Webb exhibited only one piece of cameo glass of their own manufacture at Paris; the Aurora vase. Other cameo works on display were the unfinished Pegasus vase and the Milton vase, both executed by John Northwood on commission from Thomas Wilkes Webb, the blanks being produced by Philip Pargeter.

Thomas Woodall recalled that in preparation for the Paris 1878 exhibition Mr Wilkes Webb tasked him to execute a large cameo vase. The subject matter was selected by Mr Webb to be Guido's Aurora, which Thomas regarded as 'rather ambitious for a first attempt'. It was exhibited in an unfinished state at Paris. Eventually it was completed and exhibited at the Melbourne 1880 exhibition where it was sold. http://antiquestourbridgeglass.co.uk/
