For those of you thinking likewise, then make a note of Sunday 12th May 2013 at the National Motorcycle Museum, Coventry Road, Bickenhill, Solihull B92 0EJ.

In the meantime, here's a bit of background from the Organisers themselves, Christina Glover and Paul Bishop, who, as usual, are working their socks off bringing all this together. They tell me: 'The National Glass Fair is the original specialist glass fair and attracts many of the most knowledgeable and established dealers and glass artists from all parts of the UK and Europe. With nearly 90 exhibitors, this is the largest glass fair in the country and it is recognized that they make a point of saving their best pieces for this major event.

There will be an amazing variety of exhibitors ranging from those selling Georgian tableware to glass artists showing their current work. We are pleased to announce that Basil

Loveridge has agreed to exhibit his extensive collection of Gray-Stan glass. Gray-Stan was a small factory in London that existed from 1926 to 1936. The factory is now known mainly for its multi-coloured art glass similar to Monart. The factory was started and run by Elizabeth Graydon-Stannus. Basil became interested in collecting Gray-Stan glass after visiting the superb 1987 exhibition at Broadfield House Glass Museum entitled 'British Glass Between the Wars'. This will be the first time that this important collection has been exhibited and this may be the only opportunity that the public will have to see such a large display of Gray-Stan glass in one place.'
