The aim is to encourage practicing artists to engage with the School and its students. The scheme replaces an earlier version and has been extended from four artists to ten, across many subject



disciplines. The relationship with the artists, students and the School is seen as important for all involved and 2012, we are told, proved to be very successful in bringing many benefits.
