### New stuff at Broadfield

Kari Moodie, Glass Interpretation Officer at BH, has sent news of an intriguing new solo show *Blood and Bones* by Patricia Niemann. Here is a preview of what promises to be an absorbing display: *Patricia, originally a goldsmith, is interested in human fears, anthropology, theatre and all forms of body adornment - especially objects that change the silhouette of the wearer. Much of her inspiration is drawn from working in the remote North Highlands, with its wilderness, harsh weather and funeral archaeology. On show will be unusual jewellery in precious metals and hot glass, as well as glass objects, textiles and also life-drawing, which is fundamental to her work.*
