2016 and the line-up of glassmaking talent is awesome. Full details at www.bruntnell-astley.com



New Trust launched

Not so long ago the name of Chance was synonymous with the largest glassmaking operation in the land. In its prime the site covered over 30 acres and for many decades produced specialist glass at a scale unprecedented in the UK. In doing so, the company made an invaluable contribution to the development of the UK's modern economy and society.

The supply of glass for the Crystal Palace, constructed to house the Great Exhibition of 1851, was probably the company's most famous single project but it was the design and production of lanterns for the first generation of modern lighthouses, to consistent standards of clarity and luminescence, which was arguably the company's greatest achievement. Its development of the Fresnel lens system contributed immeasurably to maritime safety, a field wherein it reigned supreme for over a century and the legacy of which can still be seen in virtually every lighthouse around the globe.



The site's doors were shut for the last time over 30 years ago and it has in the interim suffered the ignominy of inevitable decline and deterioration. Until now.

The newly launched **Chance Glass Works Heritage Trust** (CGWHT) aims to restore the buildings that are still extant on the Spon Lane site and enrich their status in being of great historical and cultural significance.

CGWHT comprises a small collective of enthusiasts from diverse backgrounds who share the common interest of working alongside the current site owners and in forging partnerships with external agencies to redevelop the site as a multi-function facility.

Toby Chance, a member of the Chance dynasty and now resident in South Africa where he is Shadow Minister for Small Business Development in the Democratic Alliance Party, has graciously accepted the role of Patron.

Your Editor declares an interest here as a Trustee of CGWHT. Whilst the roles remain separate and distinct there is a commonality of interest insomuch that CGWHT will be recognizing the glassmaking heritage of the site, which thus brings its efforts within the BGF *aegis* and vice versa.
