A New Home - a tale of efforts to secure a permanent and suitable facility for the internationally-renowned Stourbridge Glass collection is a presentation by Yours Truly that encapsulates the tale of how the BGF came together to facilitate the transformation of a derelict eyesore into the new White House Cone - museum of glass.

It is next being aired publicly at Stourbridge Library 2:30pm on Wednesday 17th August 2016. A nominal admission charge may apply.

Stourbridge Library is situated in the Crown Centre; entrance adjacent to the landmark green clock at the bottom of the High Street.

New magazine out soon
