



New book: The Dynasty Builder

David Williams-Thomas, our BGF Patron, has a distinguished career as Chairman and CEO of Royal Brierley Crystal, formerly Stevens & Williams. He is thus the ideal man to enlighten us on all matters RB/S&W. No surprise, therefore, that he is about to launch a book based on the life of one of his forebears. We let David take up the story ...



'My book is based on the diaries of one of the principal protagonists in the Victorian handmade glass industry, Samuel Cox Williams - the Dynasty Builder. Samuel lived near Stourbridge for forty years, founding Stevens and Williams in 1846 and building it into the most important Art Glass manufacturer in the world.

The work is principally about Samuel, his business and family life and is based on the diaries he kept from 1869-1883. The diaries have been hidden in the company archives until now and are transcribed in full as part of the book. It also covers the history of the firm from the end of this period up to 1998, when the family's involvement in the business finished. As Samuel's great-great-grandson, and the sixth generation to be involved, I ran the firm (which later became Royal Brierley Crystal) throughout my working life. Using public and private company and family archives, as well as personal memories, the book traces the history of the firm and the family from 1846 to 1998, with particular reference to the period of Samuel's diaries.'
