#### Submissions to GlassCuts

*GlassCuts* usually comes out on or around every alternate Tuesday, being collated during the previous week. We may be working two or three issues in advance, so under normal circumstances we appreciate your submission for, say, an event or a launch to be with us at least one month beforehand; the sooner the better. In rare instances we can 'hold the press' to include something urgent. We will try our best to accommodate this but as GC is compiled, edited and distributed entirely by volunteers it is not easy to line all our ducks up to be free at the same time at short notice.

We aim to be impartial and we do not accept advertisements per se although we are pleased to promote new products.
